Saturday's Gala Addresses Childcare **Shortage**

A critical need is being addressed by the new childcare facilities under construction at the Sanford-Springvale YMCA, the focal point of the Gala fundraising event being held Saturday evening, 4/13, from 7-10 PM.

Maine faces a significant childcare shortage, with 25% of childcare operations closing their doors since the pandemic, according to a report by Ready Nation last June. Furthermore, the report found 22% of Mainers live in a childcare "desert" where there are more than three children under the age of five for each available childcare slot. When the Sanford YMCA heard almost two years ago that there were funds available through the state to expand childcare services, they jumped on the opportunity.

The YMCA received, and will be matching, \$250,000 from the State of Maine Early Childcare Infrastructure Grant to expand their Early Learning Center in a \$775,000 project. The

expansion will include three classrooms adjacent to the existing center. The classrooms will open up 30 more childcare slots and will lower the minimum enrollment age from 3 years to 6 weeks. With assistance from community stakeholders, the classrooms are expected to be open from 6:30am to 6pm, at an affordable cost, beginning in mid-June. Funds from the Gala will go toward needed supplies and equipment to outfit the three classrooms.

The Sanford Arts Commission is envisioning the establishment of an Artist Co-Op in the Springvale-Sanford area and is inviting local artists to share their needs, interests, and ideas.

The Commission actively seeks feedback from local artists to shape the project. The overarching concept involves acquiring a building that could house a large, open co-working space alongside smaller to larger personal studio spaces, catering to a diverse array of artists in curating their artwork. The Co-Op would offer monthly rentals, with the possibility of day passes depending on space availability. Additionally, amenities and tools would be provided to renters/members, with the potential inclusion of an art gallery depending on space constraints.

York County Commissioners Look at 9.6% Hike for Municipalities

Inflation and increases in the state government's valuation of county municipalities has led to a proposed 7.38 percent increase in York County government's budget and an estimated 9.6 percent increase in municipal assessments for the fiscal year that begins July 1. The proposed budget is \$25.16 million, with \$21.55 million to be raised through taxes to the 29 cities and towns, the latter up by about \$1.88 million.

York County Commissioners began their perusal of the proposed budget for the coming year on April 3 and were to continue the process on Wednesday, April 10. If the five-member board takes a vote at that time, the spending plan then moves on to the York County Budget Committee for review and a vote on the spending plan.

The Ready Nation report found that infant care in Maine averages \$11,960 per year, exceeding the cost for in-state public college tuition by 8%. In 2022, the YMCA provided just over \$28,500 in scholarship support to their preschool families. Financial assistance through the YMCA and federal/state programs are being offered for the Early Learning Center expansion.

Greater Sanford Babe Ruth Changes Up Format for 2024

Greater Sanford Babe Ruth is reforming all teams this year to give all players the greatest opportunities.

The Board of Directors has adopted the following format for the league that serves 13 to 16-year-olds: following player assessments, a draft will be held by the team coaches and all players will be assigned to a primary team. Games are being scheduled for weeknights. On Sunday afternoons, an all-team, group skills development clinic is scheduled to ensure opportunities for each player to improve their abilities. Offensive and defensive stations ensure players get significant reps to support their in-game playing time.

Primary coaches will manage their team's development. If a player needs more game experience there are several options to improve their confidence and skills. Through coordination with other local baseball leagues, developing players will be able to take advantage of additional play time through the following:

- Travel prep team Exhibition Babe
 Ruth games against equal skill level (B
 Teams) from surrounding towns. We
 are looking to have one game per week.

Schumacher to Leave Planning Agency after 28 Years

The Southern Maine Planning and Development Commission plans to advertise nationwide to find a replacement for long-time leader Paul Schumacher, who plans to step down this summer.

Schumacher grew the agency substantially during his 28-year tenure, including the EPA Brownfields program that has funded much of the cleanup of Sanford's former textile mill buildings and the CGA site.

Schumacher says the nonprofit is thriving and he feels confident about its future; "We have some of the most highly skilled, diverse and energetic people I have ever seen at any organization, along with the resources to help them flourish. It is a wonderful confluence of personalities and talent, and I am gratified to have been a part of it over the years. For me, it's particularly rewarding to see the impact on our member communities in York County and parts of southern Oxford County."

Staffing at the agency has more than doubled to 15 in just the past four years. SMPDC's Brownfields revolving loan program grew from a \$200,000 grant in 2005, and now handles more than \$15 million, which has been invested in underutilized and hazardous sites across the region. Under Schumacher's advocacy, SMPDC was designated as its own economic development district by the U.S. Economic Development Administration, establishing a consistent

source of economic development funds for the region. Most recently, the creation of SMPDC's Regional Sustainability and Resilience program in 2020, and the addition of expert staff to lead it, has led to nearly \$6 million in leveraged funds for addressing resilience and climate change in the region.

"Providing land use planning assistance to municipalities has been a mainstay of the agency's focus for decades, but now that effort includes sharing expertise on affordable housing, broadband expansion, and transportation improvements," Schumacher said.

Prior to joining SMPDC in 1996, Schumacher worked as a Town Planner in several southern Maine towns and also at a consulting firm on Cape Cod. His retirement will begin this summer.

Houseal Leaving Early

Friday April 12 was Ian Houseal's last day of work as Sanford's Community Development Director. Houseal has worked for the city for the past seven years and has been its point person in expanding housing and upgrading substandard housing.

During Houseal's tenure, the city increased housing density in the urban core, allowed accessory dwellings on any residential lot, regulated rental housing and recycled vacant and dangerous buildings back onto the housing market.

Houseal spoke against eliminating his position during the public participation portion of a recent City Council meeting, saying the position was a full-time job in itself and could expose the city to liability without it. The City Council opted to eliminate the position and to create an assistant city manager's position, at an additional \$17,857 cost, for the budget year beginning in July. The new position will have expanded duties and could provide coverage in the absence of the city manager.




